



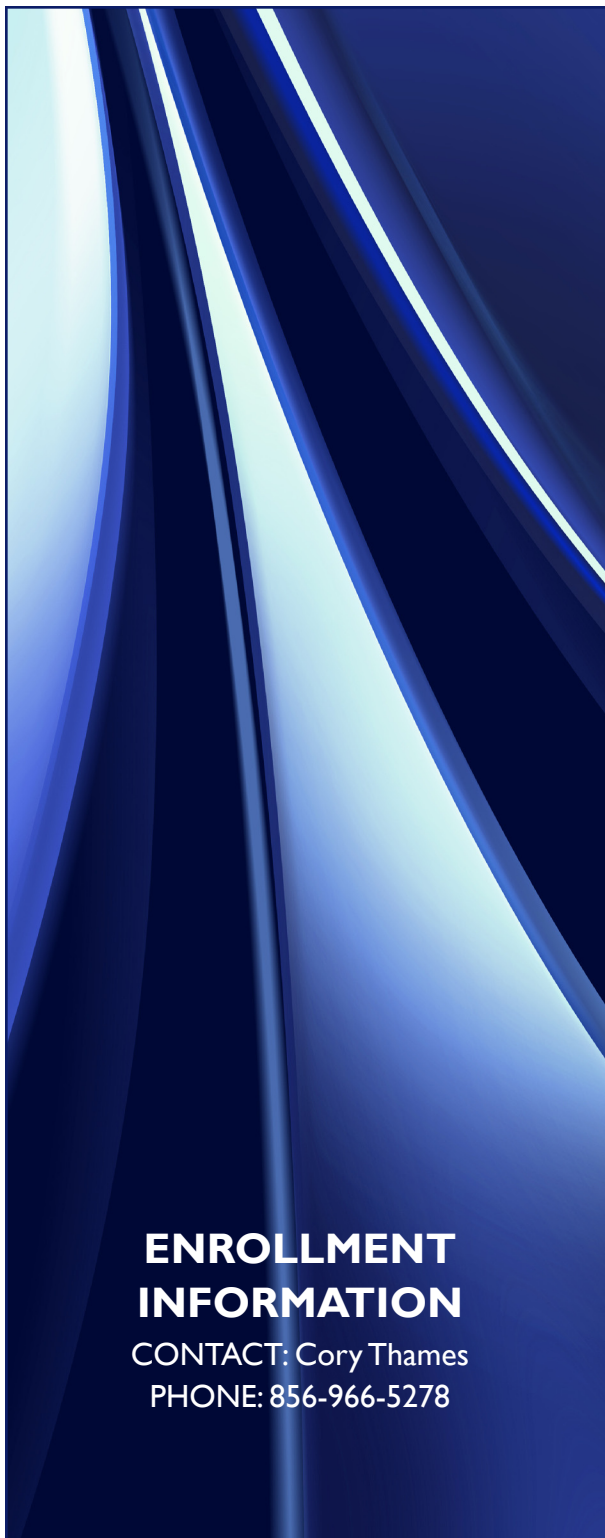
Mission Statement
